

Post-Easter Sundays: The Myrrhbearing Women



The third Sunday after Pascha is dedicated to the myrrhbearing women who cared for the body of the Saviour at his death and who were the first witnesses of His Resurrection. The three troparia of Holy Friday are sung once again and from the theme of the day:

The noble Joseph, when he had taken down Thy most pure body from the Tree, wrapped it in fine linen and anointed it with spices, and placed it in a new tomb.

When Thou didst descend to death, O Life Immortal, Thou didst slay hell with the splendor of Thy Godhead.

The angel came to the myrrhbearing women at the tomb and said: Myrrh is fitting for the dead, but Christ has shown Himself a stranger to corruption! So proclaim: The Lord is risen, granting the world great mercy.



Miscarriage, Stillbirth or Newborn Death, Memorial Service and Sharing

Grief as a Journey is an 8 week program for those searching for support in their grief over the loss of a loved one. Catholic Education Week (May 6-10) and World Catholic Education Day (May 30) is quickly approaching. It is with great anticipation that we look forward to the opportunity to celebrate publicly funded Catholic education and its distinctiveness as Christ centered learning.

Historically, publically funded Catholic education, operating in Alberta since the 1840's, has held both a unique and distinct role in Alberta's public education system. Father Albert Lacombe at Lac St. Anne and the Grey Nuns in St. Albert, established the first schools. Unbeknownst to them, 160 years later, publically funded Catholic education is presently serving 181, 000 students in 483 schools employing close to 11,000 teachers.

In Canada there are generally speaking three types of Catholic schools: Those that are publicly funded , such as those in Northwest Territories, Yukon, Ontario, Saskatchewan, and Alberta; those that receive partial funding (British Columbia, Quebec, and Manitoba); and those that receive no funding (Newfoundland, New Brunswick, Nova Scotia, and Prince Edward Island). With this in mind, it remains urgently important that advocacy for publicly funded Catholic education in Alberta remain a priority.

There is much to celebrate and showcase in publically funded Catholic education. Our schools provide a world class education to students and their families both academically and spiritually. Christ is the reason for Catholic schools and serves as role model for all. Every student is a child of God, with inherent dignity and worthy of respect, deserving abundant compassion and care.

Catholic Education Week and World Catholic Education day provide excellent opportunities to share with the broader community and stakeholders the unique gift of publicly funded Catholic education. Each of us is critically important in advocating and articulating this importance. What can you do?

- ✓ Wear blue to publicly demonstrate your support for publicly funded Catholic education,
- ✓ Bring awareness by sharing information on website, newsletters, posters, emails, and social media,
- ✓ Tell your story of Catholic education – articulate to others the importance of faith based, education, why did you attend a Catholic school, why did you choose a Catholic school for your child. Dialogue brings awareness and better understanding. Join the conversation,
- ✓ Participate in activities happening at your child's school,
- ✓ Share, like, retweet on social media the importance of publicly funded Catholic education, Follow groups such as Catholic school districts, Catholic schools, the Diocese, Grandin Media, ACSTA, GrACE to get started. Use the hashtag #IBelieveinCatholicEd.

This will be an evening of professional development, spiritual growth and networking with other catechists.


Theme for the workshop:



Changeable parts for Sunday, April 5.

After the priest has exclaimed, Blessed be the Kingdom... and the people have responded, Amen, the clergy sing the Paschal Troparion once and the people repeat it. Then, the clergy sing the first half, and the people conclude it.

Paschal Troparion

Christ is risen from the dead,* trampling death by death,* and to those in the tombs* giving life.

Troparia and Kontakia

Troparion, Tone 2: When You went down to death, O Life Immortal,* You struck Hades dead with the blazing light of Your divinity.*When You raised the dead from the nether world, all powers of heaven cried out:* O Giver of Life, Christ our God, glory to You!

Troparion, Tone 2: The noble Joseph took down Your pure body from the tree.* He wrapped it with a clean shroud and aromatic spices and placed it in a new tomb.* But on the third day You arose, O Lord,* granting the world Your great mercy.

Glory...

Kontakion, Tone 2: You commanded the myrrh-bearers to rejoice, O Christ God,* and ended the grief of our mother Eve by Your Resurrection.* You ordered the apostles to proclaim to all:* The Saviour is risen from the tomb.

Now...

Kontakion, Tone 8: Though You descended into a tomb, O Immortal One,* yet You destroyed the power of Hades;* and You rose as victor, O Christ God,* calling to the myrrh-bearing women: Rejoice!* and giving peace to Your Apostles:* You, who grant resurrection to the fallen.

Prokeimenon, Tone 6

Save Your people, O Lord, and bless Your inheritance.

verse: Unto You I will cry, O Lord my God, lest You turn from me in silence.

Epistle: Acts 6:1-7

In those days, when the disciples were increasing in number, the Hellenists complained against the Hebrews because their widows were being neglected in the daily distribution of food. And the twelve called together the whole community of the disciples and said, "It is not right that we should neglect the word of God in order to wait on tables. Therefore, friends, select from among yourselves seven men of good standing, full of the Spirit and of wisdom, whom we may appoint to this task, while we, for our part, will devote ourselves to prayer and to serving the word." What they said pleased the whole community, and they chose Stephen, a man full of faith and the Holy Spirit, together with Philip, Prochorus, Nicanor, Timon, Parmenas, and Nicolaus, a proselyte of Antioch. They had these men stand before the apostles, who

prayed and laid their hands on them. The word of God continued to spread; the number of the disciples increased greatly in Jerusalem, and a great many of the priests became obedient to the faith.

Alleluia, Tone 8

verse: You have shown favour to Your land, O Lord; You have brought back the captives of Jacob.

verse: Mercy and truth have met; righteousness and peace have embraced.

Gospel: Mark 15:43-16:9

At that time: Joseph of Arimathea, a respected member of the council, who was also himself waiting expectantly for the kingdom of God, went boldly to Pilate and asked for the body of Jesus. Then Pilate wondered if he were already dead; and summoning the centurion, he asked him whether he had been dead for some time. When he learned from the centurion that he was dead, he granted the body to Joseph. Then Joseph bought a linen cloth, and taking down the body, wrapped it in the linen cloth, and laid it in a tomb that had been hewn out of the rock. He then rolled a stone against the door of the tomb. Mary Magdalene and Mary the mother of Joseph saw where the body was laid. When the sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome bought spices, so that they might go and anoint him. And very early on the first day of the week, when the sun had risen, they went to the tomb. They had been saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance to the tomb?" When they looked up, they saw that the stone, which was very large, had already been rolled back. As they entered the tomb, they saw a young man, dressed in a white robe, sitting on the right side; and they were alarmed. But he said to them, "Do not be alarmed; you are looking for Jesus of Nazareth, who was crucified. He has been raised; he is not here. Look, there is the place they laid him. But go, tell his disciples and Peter that he is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see him, just as he told you." So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid. Now after he rose early on the first day of the week, he appeared first to Mary Magdalene, from whom he had cast out seven demons.

Hymn to the Mother of God

The Angel cried out to the One full of Grace: O chaste Virgin, rejoice! And again I say, Rejoice! Your Son has risen from the tomb on the third day, and raised the dead. Let all people rejoice! Shine, shine, O new Jerusalem! for the glory of the Lord has risen upon you! Exult now and be glad, O Sion! And you, O chaste Mother of God, take delight in the resurrection of your Son.

Communion Verse

Receive the Body of Christ;* taste the fountain of immortality.* Praise the Lord from the heavens;* praise Him in the highest Alleluia. (3)
