Covid Restrictions Have Eased:


I have had many viewers who are seniors and are unable to attend services in person and many from beyond our city. For their sake I plan to continue this ministry.

I do want to ask however that those who can come in person do so. Although watching the services online is a good way to pray, and much better than nothing, it does not compare with being part of the community and being able to receive the Eucharist.

All Liturgies that are posted can be accessed from our parish's website. These include Sunday Services, Wednesday Presanctified Services, and sometimes special services such as "Prayers for Ukraine" and "Baptisms". Most are now posted as Live Events, so you can pray with us as we celebrate in the church. Past services are also available for viewing too.

The Liturgy of the Presanctified Gifts

In Byzantine Churches the celebration of the Divine Liturgy is considered too festive for weekdays of the Great Fast (Lent). Yet the Church recognizes the intense need for the faithful to receive the Eucharist during this penitential time. In order to make it available, the church celebrates Presanctified Liturgies on Wednesday and Friday evenings. Presanctified Liturgies are basically evening prayers (Vespers) with the distribution of Eucharist. The Eucharist is consecrated during Divine Liturgy on the preceding Sunday, is kept in the Tabernacle, and then is brought out to the people during the service.

This year we will have Presanctified Liturgies on Wednesdays at 7 pm in our parish (unless we have a PPC meeting, in which case we will do it at 5:30).

I will not have Presanctified Liturgies on Fridays due to a commitment I made to teach Catechism every other Friday. You can certainly join another parish at their service, or you can re-watch/attend the Liturgy that we record on Wednesday via Youtube.

On all Wednesdays that are followed by an "All Souls" Saturday we will also include a Panachyda (prayers of the deceased) mentioning the names of all of our loved ones. If you would like to submit or update your family's list of departed, hand a paper to Fr. Bo.

Fr. Bo continues to do Youth Ministry.

Epistle: Hebrews 4:14-5:6 (NRSV)

Brothers and Sisters, since, then, we have a great high priest who has passed through the heavens, Jesus, the Son of God, let us hold fast to our confession. For we do not have a high priest who is unable to sympathize with our weaknesses, but we have one who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sin. Let us therefore approach the throne of grace with boldness, so that we may receive mercy and find grace to help in time of need.

Every high priest chosen from among mortals is put in charge of things pertaining to God on their behalf, to offer gifts and sacrifices for sins. He is able to deal gently with the ignorant and wayward, since he himself is subject to weakness; and because of this he must offer sacrifice for his own sins as well as for those of the people. And one does not presume to take this honor, but takes it only when called by God, just as Aaron was.

So also Christ did not glorify himself in becoming a high priest, but was appointed by the one who said to him, "You are my Son, today I have begotten you"; as he says also in another place, "You are a priest forever, according to the order of Melchizedek."

Gospel: Mark 8:34-9:1 (NRSV)

The Lord said, "If any want to become my followers, let them deny themselves and take up their cross and follow me. For those who want to save their life will lose it, and those who lose their life for my sake, and for the sake of the gospel, will save it. For what will it profit them to gain the whole world and forfeit their life? Indeed, what can they give in return for their life? Those who are ashamed of me and of my words in this adulterous and sinful generation, of them the Son of Man will also be ashamed when he comes in the glory of his Father with the holy angels." And he said to them, "Truly I tell you, there are some standing here who will not taste death until they see that the kingdom of God has come with power."
